Ioanna Kohler est la nouvelle directrice des Opérations et de la Communication de CampusFrance USA à Washington, D.C.

Ioanna a dirigé de 2007 à 2011 les programmes de politique sociale à la French-American Foundation de New York où elle a conçu et mis en oeuvre de nombreux projets d’échange destinés à des acteurs-clés de la recherche universitaire, du gouvernement et du secteur privé, en France et aux Etats-Unis. Elle a organisé de nombreux voyages d’étude, conférences et séminaires à Paris, New York et Washington, D.C., coordonné un programme de professeur invité avec Sciences Po Paris, et supervisé la publication de nombreux documents et rapports en français et en anglais portant sur des problématiques franco-américaines.

Ioanna a réalisé, en collaboration avec Daniel Sabbagh, directeur de recherche au CERI-Sciences Po, une étude comparée sur les stratégies visant à démocratiser l’accès à l’enseignement sélectif dans les deux pays. Elle est aussi l’auteur, pour l’Institut Montaigne, d’une étude intitulée « *Gone for Good ? Partis pour de bon ? Les Expatriés de l’enseignement supérieur français aux Etats-Unis* », publiée en novembre 2010.

Diplômée de Sciences Po Paris en 1999, Ioanna a étudié à l’université de Paris III-Sorbonne Nouvelle où elle a obtenu sa Maîtrise de Lettres Modernes et une licence de Cinéma. Aux Etats-Unis, elle a obtenu un Certificat en Relations Publiques à New York University. Elle est née à Londres et a grandi en Grèce. Elle parle le grec et est bilingue français-anglais.
